

Our History: Collaborating For Youth

- 2001 Collaborating for Youth (CFY) Coalition was formed
- 2003-2005 Drug Free Communities Coalition (DFC) designation under the management of SAMHSA.
- 2007 Center for Youth & Community Development (CFYCD) was established as the nonprofit home for CFY. First countywide Pennsylvania Youth Survey.
- 2009 the CFY Youth Coalition was established.
- 2010 CFYCD became the provider for a CFY partnership evidence-based program, Strengthening Families.
- 2015 SFP expanded to reach the Spanish language population through Familias Fuertes.
- 2018 Century 21 Afterschool Programs
- 2020 Strategic Prevention Framework (SPF)
- 2022 la Comunidad
- 2023 LGBTQIA+ Youth Initiative

Integrated Children's Services Planning

- In 2009 the Pennsylvania Department of Public Welfare began an initiative within the county categorical agencies in the primary goal of bringing together all resources serving children and families.
- A **comprehensive approach** to serving children, birth to 21 years of age, through programs focusing on long-term prevention, early intervention, services that support family stability, child safety, community protection and healthy child development.
- Prevention services in Adams County are based on priorities determined through community assessments, leading to healthier young people within safer families and communities.



Collaborating For Youth is committed to the vision of a fully integrated service system whereby one can enter the system through any door and obtain the services that they may need or want, in an integrated fashion.

Drug Free Communities - 10 Years

- Collaborating For Youth became one of only 700 coalitions across the nation to be a federally designated *Drug Free Communities* Coalition by the Office of National Drug Control Policy.
- DFC establishes and strengthens collaboration among communities to prevent and reduce substance use among youth.
- DFC reduces substance use among youth and, over time, reduces substance use among adults.
- What have we learned? Strong communities provide an environment for positive youth development.

Building positive community messages that reduce risky behaviors...

CFY conducts several campaigns along with other activities aimed at changing community norms, attitudes and behaviors, and reducing availability, forming the core CFY targeted strategies for reducing youth substance abuse.




